JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner (*Bhagwant Kaur*) did not possess one of the essential qualifications of Certificate in Physical Education, while competing for the advertised post of PTIs. Her writ petition, challenging the action was allowed, holding that the petitioner had to be considered eligible as she possessed a higher qualification of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed.), that was in line with the prescribed qualifications, and hence entitled to appointment, if found within the selection zone.

Since the appointment was not given to the petitioner inspite of being falling within the selection zone, the instant contempt was filed.

Now, the applicant-petitioner has moved an application bearing **CM No. 20480-CII of 2019**, seeking an unconditional withdrawal of the contempt in view of the respondent/State of Punjab having issued an appointment letter dated 01.11.2018 in respect of the petitioner as PTI.

In view of the contents of the aforesaid **application (CM No. 20480-CII of 2019)**, duly supported by the affidavit of the petitioner, the same is '**allowed**' and the **main contempt petition** is “**dismissed as withdrawn**”.

Since the main case has been dismissed as withdrawn, no orders are required to be passed in the pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, and the same also stand(s) disposed of.
