Petitioner has filed this criminal writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondent Nos.2 and 3 to protect his life and liberty and also directing respondent Nos.4 to 14 not to interfere in his personal life.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of Court, Ms.Monika Jalota, learned Deputy Advocate General, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that petitioner is owner of huge land and respondent Nos.4 to 14, tried to take possession of the property illegally in collusion with his daughter and previously got registered a false case against the petitioner under Section 302 IPC, wherein he has been acquitted by the trial Court. According to her, the life and liberty of the petitioner and his family members are not safe as the

respondents are continuously extending threats to them. She has also produced a copy of the application dated 18.01.2020 given to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Barnala.

Considering the above background, but without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is disposed off with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Barnala to look into the representation of the petitioner and take action in accordance with law, if so required.
