B.S. Walia, J (Oral)

1. Mr. Sachin Gupta, Advocate has filed Power of Attorney on behalf of respondent No. 3 in Court today. The same is taken on record.
2. Copy of representation dated 24.01.2020 is taken on record. Copy thereof supplied to learned counsel for the respondents.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner would be satisfied if the writ petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to supply the information sought for by him in order to enable him to file reply to the charge-sheet.
4. Learned counsel for the respondents states that the information sought for by the petitioner vide application dated 24.01.2020, copy of which has been handed over to the learned counsel for the respondents would be supplied to the petitioner in case of availability within two weeks, where after the reply should

be filed by the petitioner within a period of 21 days of supply of documents by the respondents to the petitioner.

5. The same satisfies learned counsel for the petitioner.

6. In view of the position as noted above, the writ petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to supply the information sought for by the petitioner vide representation dated 24.01.2020, in case the same is available within a period of two weeks from today.

7. On receipt of the information supplied for, the petitioner would file reply to the charge-sheet within a period of 21 days thereafter, where after the enquiry proceedings would be conducted, in accordance with law.

8. Writ petition stands disposed of as above.
