Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Through this petition, the petitioner seeks regular bail in case bearing FIR No.98 dated 23.06.2019, registered at Police Station Division No.1, District Ludhiana, under Sections 379-B(2) and 411 IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner has falsely been involved in the present case. The petitioner was not named in the FIR nor any role has been attributed to him. The recovery has already been effected. It is further submitted that after presentation of the challan, charges have already been framed. The petitioner has been in custody since 15.09.2019 and that no useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner behind the bars.

Learned State counsel, while opposing the prayer for grant of bail, has drawn the attention of this Court towards the custody certificate dated 14.10.2020, which indicates that the petitioner has undergone the under-trial period of 1 year and 27 days. Besides, the petitioner is also

involved in two other cases bearing FIR No.280 dated 19.12.2018 under Sections 379-B/34 IPC and FIR No.68 dated 9.04.2017 under Sections 379,411 IPC.

Taking into consideration the criminal antecedents of the petitioner, the petitioner does not deserve the concession of regular bail as any such indulgence may result into his involvement in similar other offences in future.

No case for grant of regular bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.
