LALIT BATRA, J. (Oral)

A bare perusal of contents of instant petition reveals that petitioner-Gurvinder Singh is seeking protection to his life and liberty. Though petitioner may have some grievance against respondents No.5 to 11 but while moving instant petition, he cannot use protection in the form of weapon against respondents No.5 to 11. In case petitioner has got some substantive grievance, he can approach respondent No.4-SHO concerned and then Police Authorities would look into that grievance and redress the same in accordance with law.

However, it is made clear that protection to life and liberty is fundamental right of each and every citizen but at the same time it should not be used as weaponry against the rights of other citizens/individuals. In these terms instant petition stands disposed of.
