It has been brought to the notice of the Court that respondent No.6 has expired, against whom the allegations were made with regard to he having helped respondent No.5 in her appointment as an Anganwadi Worker in the year 1997. In the light of the fact that there are personal allegations against respondent No.6, who is no more in a position to respond thereto and also keeping in view the fact that respondent No.5 is working as an Anganwadi Worker since 1997 apart from the fact that there appears to be no justification for concluding that there was any interference on the part of respondent No.6 while making selection for appointment to the post of Anganwadi Worker, this Court does not find any ground for interfering in the selection of respondent No.5.

2. The writ petition, therefore, stands dismissed.
