Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.228 dated 19.11.2019 under Sections 323, 324, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Section 307 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Sidhwan Bet, District Ludhiana.

As per the allegations in the FIR, registered at the instance of Piara Singh, when he, along with his brother Pappu Singh were working in their field, suddenly, Husan Lal, petitioner-Amritpal Singh, @ Lalli, Satpal Singh, Kundan Singh, Ramandeep Kaur and Jamna Kaur came there. Husan Lal attacked on the right side of the head his brother with Gandasa, which resulted into deep injury. Then petitioner-Amritpal @ Lalli raised a lalkara that let a lesson be taught to both brothers. Amritpal Singh @ Lalli, Satpal Singh and Kundal Singh started beating both the brothers with Danda, which they were

carrying. Later on, when an alarm was raised, Jaspal Singh and Manpreet Singh came at the spot and the accused ran away.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the injury attributed to the petitioner is simple in nature.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Pahara Singh, and assisted by counsel for the complainant, has opposed the prayer for bail on the ground that as per the CT Scan report of victim Pappu, there are few hemorrhagic contusions with surrounding edema in the left temporal lobe and fracture of the right parietal bone, extending into the squamous and mastoid part of the right temporal bone. The nature of injuries were declared dangerous to life.

After hearing counsel for the parties and considering the serious allegations, no ground for grant of concession of anticipatory bail is made out.

Accordingly, the present petition stands dismissed.
