All cases listed today have been taken up for hearing by way of video conferencing because of the situation existing due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This is the 2nd petition by which the petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail, upon FIR No. 25 having been registered against him at Police Station City Banga, District SBS Nagar, on 27.04.2019, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under Sections 406 and 420 of the IPC.

On 07.07.2020, the following order had been passed:-

“All cases listed today have been taken up for hearing by way of video conferencing because of the situation existing due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that though this is the second petition filed by the petitioner seeking the concession of anticipatory bail, with the first one having been dismissed in September, 2019, the matter has since been compromised with the complainant.

However, though Mr.Bikramjit Singh Randhawa is stated to be the counsel for the complainant, he has not come online either in the forenoon session nor in the afternoon session (atleast at the time when the case was called out).

Consequently, adjourned to 14.07.2020.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that in the meanwhile, the petitioner would also pay the amount as is demanded by the complainant, by the next date of hearing.”

Thereafter, with even two more dates having gone by in between, the said order has still not been complied with, with learned counsel for the petitioner now seeking to withdraw this petition.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
