Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.308 dated 28.12.2019, under Sections 148/149/307/323/506 IPC, registered at Police Station Sector-14, Panchkula, District Panchkula. He apprehended his arrest at the hands of police in the abovesaid FIR.

The FIR was registered on the basis of statement of complainant Suraj, wherein it was stated that he got married in the year 2016 and has a son and a daughter. On 26.12.2019, at about 5:15 p.m., he went from his house to eat eggs from the rehri situated outside the Budhanpur Gurudwara, where Pradumn was already standing there, who was resident of his colony and had called Abhyas and told him that the complainant was already standing near eggs rehri, with whom quarrel had taken place and they would teach him a lesson. He called Abhyas to come there with 2-3 boys with weapons and when the complainant was eating eggs then Abhyas gave a knife blow in the middle of his neck from backside and when he turned back side then Abhyas gave 2-3 knife blows in his

abdomen and other boys gave rod and knife blows on his back and when he fell down, then all the boys again gave blows on the person of the complainant. When he raised hue and cry, then his uncle, namely, Pardip came there and all the boys fled away from the spot with their respective weapons. On these broad allegations, the present FIR was registered.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the parties have settled the matter by way of a compromise. According to him, the petitioner is not attributed any injury as the alleged knife blows were given by co-accused, namely, Abhyas.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court finds that the petitioner is specifically named in the FIR, who allegedly called his accomplice Abhyas on the spot, who gave multiple knife blows to the victim.

Considering the seriousness of the offence, this Court is not inclined to grant the extra ordinary concession of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner.

Petition is dismissed.
