The present contempt petition has been filed under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971, praying for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondents for willful and intentional disobedience of the order dated 10th July, 2019. The operative part of order dated 10th July, 2019, reads as under:-

“The writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to pass a speaking order by objectively considering the averments as made in the representation dated 15.01.2017(Annexure P-9) as also the contents of the instant writ petition by treating the same as supplementary representation, in accordance with law.

Let the needful be done within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the aforesaid direction has not been complied with.

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On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instructions from Mr.Balbir Singh, Assistant Director, has submitted that in fact, respondent No.2 has already passed an order and copy thereof shall be supplied to the petitioners within a period of one week.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, the present contempt petition is rendered infructuous and is disposed of as such. However, respondent No.2 is impressed upon to send a copy of the order passed within a period of one week, positively.
