The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.175 dated 05.11.2018 under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Badhni Kalan, District Moga.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is only a salesman in a medical store and was employed at a salary of ₹7,000/- per month. The allegations against the petitioner are that he was found in possession of Tramadol with a total weight of 465.6 grams. He also contends that the petitioner is in custody for over 01 year and 11 months and has been acquitted in two other cases under the NDPS Act.

Learned State counsel has filed reply by way of an affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Nihal Singh Wala, district Moga in Court, which indicates that the petitioner was also convicted in another case under the

NDPS Act registered at Police Station Shahkot, district Jalandhar. He also contends that 02 out of 11 prosecution witnesses have been examined.

Heard through video conferencing.

The allegations against the petitioner are that he was found in possession of commercial quantity of Tramadol. He is also involved in another case under the NDPS Act wherein he has been convicted. Therefore, I do not deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner at this stage. Consequently, the petition stands dismissed.

However, the trial Court is directed to conclude the trial expeditiously.
