File has been taken for hearing through video conference due to Covid-19 pandemic.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that report of the Inspection Committee (Annexure P-13) is incorrect and the petitioners intend to raise objections qua the findings which have been recorded by the Inspection Committee before the competent authority i.e. respondent No. 2-University before any decision is taken on the basis of the said report. Learned counsel for the petitioners further states that the objections to the said inspection report will be filed by the petitioner with the respondent-University within a period of seven days from today. Learned counsel for the petitioners prays that appropriate directions be given to the respondent-University to pass appropriate orders on the claim of the petitioners expeditiously thereafter, after taking into consideration objections of the petitioners.

Ms. Shruti Jain, learned Deputy Advocate General, Haryana

and Mr. Kuldeep Tiwari, learned Additional Advocate General, Haryana, who have also joined the proceedings through video conference, keeping in view the service of advance separate copies of petition, accept notice on behalf of respondent No. 1 as well as respondent No. 2 respectively.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No. 2 submits that in case petitioners have any objection to the inspection report (Annexure P-13), they should submit their objections and the said objections will be taken into consideration by the respondent-University while passing appropriate order on the claim submitted by the petitioners, while considering the recommendations of the Inspection Committee (Annexure P-13). Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No. 2 further states that in case the objections are submitted by the petitioners within a period of seven days as undertaken by the learned counsel for the petitioners, appropriate order will be passed within a period of 15 days thereafter.

Keeping in view the statement given by learned counsel for respondent No. 2, learned counsel for the petitioners states that no further grievance of the petitioners subsists as of today in the present writ petition and the same may be disposed of having been not pressed at this stage.

Ordered accordingly.

Parties will be bound by their statements recorded above.
