Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.95 dated 11.11.2019, registered under Sections 323, 324, 427, 452, 34 of Indian Penal Code, at Police Station Begowal, District Kapurthala.

On 11.05.2020, following order was passed by this Court:-

“The case has been taken up for hearing through video-conferencing.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in respect of occurrence dated 09.11.2019, the FIR in question came to be registered on 11.11.2019.

Learned counsel further contends that only offence under Section 452 IPC is non-bailable offence.

Petitioner is alleged to have given a 'datar' blow on the upper side of right foot which is found to be a blunt injury on the person of the complainant, contrary to the nature of weapon allegedly used by the petitioner. The injury is on the non-vital part of the body. Petitioner has not given any push to the mother of the complainant.

During intervening period from 09.11.2019 to 11.11.2019, the version and cross-version in FIR No.94 dated 10.11.2019 came to be registered on the statement of one Sarabdeep Singh @ Sagar and the present FIR is the outcome of said case.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to

join investigation on 18.05.2020 at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on interim bail, subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel on instructions from SI Surinderjit Singh submits that in pursuance of aforesaid order, petitioner has joined the investigation on 18.05.2020 and recoveries have been effected.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation and is no more required in further investigation of the case, therefore, order dated 11.05.2020 is made absolute. However, petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do so by the Investigating Officer.
