The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.96 dated 02.05.2020 registered under Sections 51(b) of the Disaster Management, Act, 2005, 188, 269 IPC and Section 61 of the Punjab Excise Act, 1947 (Haryana Amendment Bill 2020), registered at Police Station Rattia, District Fatehabad.

On 11.05.2020, following order was passed by this Court:-

"The case has been taken up for hearing through

video-conferencing.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the tubewell has been installed by the lesses namely Jagvir and Gurcharan Singh. Allegations are that the petitioner was preparing lahan. 80 liters of lahan was allegedly recovered from the spot. Act of preparation of lahan in a drum would remain debatbale as to the specifications of lahan, if any.

Notice of motion for 14.07.2020.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 18.05.2020 at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on interim bail, subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that in compliance of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from HC Angrej Singh admitted the aforesaid fact and submitted that the petitioner is no more required for further investigation of the case. Petitioner is also involved in another case of cheating and fraud in Punjab, in which he is on bail.

Be that as it may, since the petitioner has joined the investigation, therefore, interim order dated 11.05.2020 is made absolute. Petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as

and when directed to do so and he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
