This is an application for exemption from filing Court fee/welfare stamp/P.F in the case.

Application is allowed as prayed for.

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The petition has been taken for hearing through video conference due to Covid-19 pandemic.

The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for the grant of anticipatory bail in respect of FIR No.110 dated 18.03.2020, under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, 1985 registered at Police Station City Mandi Dabwali, District Sirsa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that the petitioner is being roped in the said case only on the basis of disclosure statement of co-accused Charanjit Kaur, from whom 1000 intoxicant tablets of Tramadol Hydrochloride were recovered.

Mr. Apoorv Garg, learned Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, who has joined the proceedings through video conference, keeping in view the service of advance copy of petition, argues that once the co-accused has made a statement that 1000 intoxicant tablets of Tramadol Hydrochloride were purchased by her from the petitioner, the allegations are specific and need to be investigated.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of this case, especially, when the fact regarding the involvement of the petitioner has already come out during the investigation, no ground to extend the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.
