Sanjay Kumar, J.

The petitioner is one amongst the accused in FIR No.66 dated 22.04.2020 on the file of Police Station Bhikhi, District Mansa, registered under Sections 306 and 34 IPC. By way of this petition, she seeks grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C.

Mr. Jagjit Gill, learned counsel for the petitioner, would contend that the marriage of the deceased with the brother of the petitioner took place about 12 years ago while the petitioner's marriage took place three years prior to that. He would further state that the petitioner did not even reside at the same place where her brother and the deceased stayed.

Learned counsel would assert that the allegation against the petitioner with

regard to medicines not being supplied to the deceased is without basis and

that material is available with the petitioner to prove to the contrary.

Given the aforestated facts, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioner would be entitled to grant of protection subject to conditions.

The petition is accordingly allowed directing the release of the petitioner in the event of her arrest in FIR No.66 dated 22.04.2020 on the file of Police Station Bhikhi, District Mansa, subject to the petitioner furnishing a personal bond for a sum of ₹10,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall join and cooperate with the investigation as and when called upon to do so. She shall also abide by the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
