The petitioner seeks grant of regular bail in case FIR No. 92 dated 05.10.2019 registered under Sections 306, 380, 34 IPC at Police Station Sadar Rupnagar, District Rupnagar.

According to the FIR, the petitioner alongwith her son allegedly took jewellery from the house of her second husband which led to his suicide.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the allegations do not make any offence under Section 306 IPC. Further, the petitioner has been in custody since 11.11.2019 and the trial is not likely to be concluded at an early date as examination of PWs has not yet commenced, although charge has already been framed. Thus, the petitioner may be granted regular bail.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Chaman Singh admits the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Keeping in view the fact that the trial is not likely to be concluded at an early date as well as keeping in view the custody period of the petitioner,

I deem it appropriate to grant regular bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the

petition is allowed and the petitioner is directed to be released on regular bail on her furnishing bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
