This is a petition for regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C. filed on behalf of the petitioner in case FIR No.52 dated 19.01.2020, under Sections 307 of the IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Model Town, District Panipat.

[2]. Ld. State counsel with reference to the direction given in the last order, submits that custody certificate of the petitioner is available but due to some technical difficulty, it could not be forwarded to the Court. Submits further that on perusal of the custody certificate, it is verified that the petitioner has been actually acquitted in the case, in which, he was implicated under Sections 286 and 336 of the IPC read with Section 27 of the Arms Act in connection with FIR No.213 dated 08.06.2019 of Police Station Civil Lines, Sonapat.

[3]. It has already been noted on the last date that the MLR of the victim was not in consonance with the story of his being shot at by the petitioner as according to the examining Doctor “three small abrasions” of miniscular dimensions on the Right Leg Lateral Aspect of the Victim were found, which were all designated as “simple injuries” and it was clearly mentioned that the weapon used was a “blunt weapon” instead of a gun-shot/firearm.

[4]. In this view of the matter, considering the long detention undergone by the petitioner and the fact that his detention is no longer required in the interest of investigation since the challan has already been submitted, he is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to appropriate terms and conditions to the satisfaction of the Ld. Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned.
