The matter has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to outbreak of COVID-19.

Prayer in this criminal writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of direction to respondents No.1 to 3 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of private respondents No.4 and 5.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that present is a second marriage of petitioner No.1-Jaspreet Kaur. Her first marriage was dissolved in proceedings under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act vide judgment dated 10.02.2016 passed by learned District Judge, Patiala. In this manner, petitioner No.1 is competent to solemnize marriage with petitioner No.2. Both the petitioners are major and have solemnized their marriage in accordance with law. However, the private respondents are not accepting their marriage and are adamant to separate them from each other by

resorting to illegal means. Learned counsel further submits that in view of imminent danger to the life and liberty of the petitioners, they have moved a representation dated 28.05.2020 (Annexure P-6) to respondent No.2- Superintendent of Police, Kaithal, District Kaithal.

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3 only at this stage.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Manish Bansal, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

Without going into the validity of the marriage of the petitioners, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.2- Superintendent of Police, Kaithal, District Kaithal to take appropriate remedial measures on the representation dated 28.05.2020 (Annexure P-6) submitted by the petitioners as warranted by law.

In the meantime, necessary order be passed to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioners.
