The petitioner is one of the 10 accused in FIR No.04 dated 16.01.2020 on the file of Police Station Sector-19, Chandigarh, registered under Sections 419, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC. By way of this petition, he seeks grant of regular bail.

Perusal of the Reply filed by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Cyber Crime, Investigation Cell & I.T., Chandigarh, reflects that the offence alleged involved swindling of amounts on the pretext of reviving lapsed insurance policies. During the course of investigation, the police found that a call center had been established for this purpose. The petitioner was one amongst those arrested from the said call center. However, no specific overt acts were attributed to the petitioner, who is stated to have become an employee of some of the other accused only in October, 2019.

Ms. Ashima Mor, learned Additional Public Prosecutor, U.T., Chandigarh, does not dispute these facts. In such circumstances, the petitioner would be entitled to grant of regular bail subject to conditions.

The petition is accordingly allowed directing release of the petitioner on regular bail in FIR No.04 dated 16.01.2020 on the file of Police Station Sector-19, Chandigarh, upon his furnishing a personal bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the Illaqa/Duty Magistrate concerned. Further, the petitioner shall not offer any inducement, threat or promise to any person connected with the case.
