The instant petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking regular bail in case FIR No.206, dated 26.10.2016, under Sections 379-B, 472 and 511 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sadar, District Jalandhar.

[2]. The petitioner was originally granted bail in this case, but he subsequently absented from the proceedings, on account of which coercive processes were issued against him.

[3]. The petitioner's submission in this regard is that he had gone to perform the ritual ceremony of his deceased-mother, after which he went to Rajasthan in connection with his business, but could not return from there in

time due to the loss suffered in such business.

[4]. The petitioner was subsequently arrested in connection with another case, bearing FIR No.272, dated 22.10.2019, and was thereafter produced before the Ld. Trial Court in the present case on 29.02.2020, on the basis of production warrant.

[5]. Considering the long detention undergone by the petitioner following his re-production/re-arrest in the Ld. Trial Court, at this stage, he is ordered to be released on regular bail to the satisfaction of the Ld. Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, concerned, subject to imposition of appropriately stringent terms and conditions, which are left with the discretion of the said Court.
