The instant Petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking Regular Bail on behalf of the Petitioner in case FIR No.417, dated 27th June, 2019, registered under Sections 302, 303, 34, 212, 201, 387, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, at Police Station Sector 7, Faridabad.

2. Reply on behalf of the State has been filed by way of Affidavit of the Assistant Commissioner of Police, Crime, District Faridabad along with its Annexures.

3. Perusal of the extracts from the CFSL Report (Annexure R-1) appended thereto goes to indicate that nothing incriminating was recovered from the mobile-phone of the Petitioner nor any material such as exchange

of messages/conversation to indicate any hobnobbing between the Petitioner and the Gangster-Kaushal @ Naresh, of which note has already been made in the earlier orders passed on 17th June, 2020 and 10th September, 2020, could be discovered.

4. Trial in the case is yet to commence inasmuch as even the Charges are yet to be framed and no less than 71 witnesses have been cited on behalf of the Prosecution Side.

5. In such circumstances, there does not appear to be any justification to cancel the interim bail already granted to the Petitioner on the last date, at this stage. The same is, therefore, ordered to be confirmed.
