This application is ordered and the status report along with the affidavit are taken on record. Exemption is granted as prayed for.

COC-1064-2020

This contempt case was instituted alleging willful disobedience to the order dated 20.05.2020 passed by a Division Bench of this Court in **CWP-7324-2020**, titled '**M/s Gaur Trading Company Vs. Union Territory, Chandigarh and others'**. By the said order, this Court directed the respondents in the writ petition to refund the amount along with interest @ 6% per annum on or before 28.05.2020. The respondents admittedly returned the principal amount of Rs.71,29,800/- on 21.05.2020, i.e., one day

after the passing of the Division Bench order, but no interest was paid thereon in terms of the order.

Mr. Pankaj Jain, learned senior standing counsel for Union Territory Chandigarh, appearing for the respondents, would point out that the Division Bench order does not spell out the period for which the interest is due and payable. Faced with this situation, Mr. Sunil Kumar Bhardwaj, learned counsel for the petitioner, would state that an appropriate application would be filed before the Division Bench for a clarification on this aspect.

In that view of the matter, the contempt case is disposed of leaving it open to the petitioner to take appropriate steps in future, if warranted.
