Matter has been taken up through Video Conferencing via Webex facility in the light of the Pandemic Covid-19 situation and as per instructions.

Instant petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking regular bail to the petitioner pending trial in case FIR No.195, dated 11.08.2019, under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station City Rajpura, District Patiala.

Counsel for the parties have been heard.

As per prosecution version, alleged recovery from the present petitioner is of 8000 intoxicant tablets containing salt of Diphenoxylate Hydrochloride. The alleged recovery would fall in commercial quantity and the bar envisaged under Section 37 of the NDPS Act would be attracted.

This Court does not find any infirmity in the order dated 24.02.2020 passed by Id. Judge, Special Court, Patiala in declining the benefit of bail.

Petition is dismissed.
