LISA GILL, J.

This matter is being taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to the outbreak of pandemic, COVID-19.

Petitioners seek protection of their life and liberty as they apprehend danger at the hands of respondents No.4 to 6 and other relatives because they have married each other on 08.06.2020 against the wishes of the said respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he has identified the petitioners as per the documents attached. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioners are present in his office. It is further submitted that they have solemnized marriage with each other out of their own free will and volition and that this is their first marriage. It is

contended that the petitioners are major, their dates of birth being 14.01.1999 and 02.02.1997, respectively. True copies of Aadhar Card of both the petitioners have been appended with the petition as Annexures P1 and P3, respectively. A copy of the Marriage Certificate and the photographs of the marriage are on record as Annexures P5 and P6, respectively. Petitioners, it is stated, have submitted representation dated 09.06.2020 (Annexure P7) to respondents No.2 and 3 i.e., the Superintendent of Police, Palwal and SHO, Police Station Chandhat, District Palwal for redressal of their grievance but no action has been taken thereon.

Notice of motion to respondents no.1 to 3.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Anmol Malik, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3. Advance copy of the petition stands served to him.

Without commenting upon the age of the petitioners or the validity of their marriage or the validity and genuineness of the certificates/documents appended with the petition, respondent No.2 – the Superintendent of Police, Palwal is directed to look into representation dated 09.06.2020 submitted by the petitioners and take appropriate action if any/as may be required, keeping in view the threat perception to the petitioners.

It is, however, made clear that this order shall have no effect on the validity of the alleged marriage of the petitioners and neither will any other civil or criminal proceedings initiated against the petitioners be barred due to this order.

Petition is disposed of accordingly.
