The instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No.123 dated 16.10.2018, under Sections 323, 324, 326, 34 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sadar Kapurthala, District Kapurthala.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are falsely implicated in the present case and on the direction of this Court, have joined the investigation. It is also submitted that matter stands compromised and a petition bearing CRM-M-22235 of 2019 has already been for quashing of the aforesaid FIR.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Tirlochan Singh, submits that petitioners have joined the investigation and they are not required for the custodial interrogation. She does not dispute the fact that the matter stands compromised.

On the other hand, counsel for the complainant also does not dispute the factum of compromise.

In view of the facts that the petitioners are not required for custodial interrogation and have joined the investigation, without commenting on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed and order dated 15.06.2020 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 Sub Section 2 Clauses (i) (ii) and (iii) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
