Main cases

Petitioners, Gulzar Singh, Kuldeep Singh and Gurnam Singh are
seeking regular bail in FIR No.46 dated 23.05.2020, lodged under Section 3
Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, Sections 148, 149, 188, 269, 270, 323, 379, 506
IPC, registered at Police Station Raipur Rani, Panchkula, Haryana.

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Counsel for the petitioners submit that the petitioners are in custody since the date of the FIR. It is submitted that there is no attribution to Gulzar Singh as per the allegations, apart from being a member of the illegal assembly. Kuldeep Singh and Gurnam Singh are alleged to have inflicted injuries by way of stick upon complainant-Rahul and his servant Mange Ram. It is further submitted that the injuries received by the complainant are blunt and simple in nature. The dispute is regarding a plot/bara in the village and there was civil litigation between other parties qua the said plot which was also subject matter of RSA before this Court (Annexure P-2) wherein it has been held that possession cannot be established.

Accordingly, keeping in view the period already undergone by the petitioners and the nature of injuries which have been attributed to the petitioners, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioners are entitled for benefit of grant of regular bail. Accordingly, regular bail is granted to the petitioners on furnishing of bail bonds/surety bonds, to the satisfaction of the Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Panchkula.

Petitions stand disposed of.
