LISA GILL, J.

This matter is being taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to the outbreak of the pandemic, COVID-19.

A complaint was submitted by the petitioner – Sh. Bijender Sansanwal alleging that his daughter and her children were kidnapped by his son-in-law Sombir Dagar and were being illegally detained at the instance of his son-in-law. A matrimonial dispute is stated to be pending between his daughter and son-in-law. The petitioner's daughter was stated to be living separately for the time being alongwith her children. It is submitted that the father of Sombir Dagar i.e. Rishi Raj Dagar is working as Sub Inspector with Haryana Police and is currently posted at Sonipat city. The petitioner's son-in-law Sombir Dagar is stated to be working as Ahlmad at the Tis Hazari Court at New Delhi. The complaint was treated as a habeas corpus petition and notice was issued to the State.

Status report by way of affidavit of Dr. Ravinder Kumar, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, city Sonipart has been filed wherein it is stated that on receipt of notice of this petition, the petitioner was

approached on 15.07.2020, for verification of the facts. The petitioner disclosed that his daughter alongwith both the grand children were now living with him. Dismissal of this petition is, thus, prayed for.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, submit that though the petitioner's daughter and his grand children are now residing with the petitioner, the police authorities and specifically Sub Inspector Bijender Singh and ASI Balwan alongwith DSP Inder Kumar, have played a very unhappy role in the entire proceedings and they are playing in the hands of the petitioner's son-in-law and his father. Certain other allegations have also been raised with a specific assertion that conversations of the petitioner with the said officials have also been recorded and are available with the petitioner.

Be that as it may, it is not in dispute that the petitioner's daughter and grand children are now residing with him. Therefore, no further order need to be passed in the present petition. However, the petitioner/his daughter are at liberty to avail remedy/remedies as may be available to them for redressal of their grievances. In case, a complaint is moved in respect to the act and conduct of the police officials mentioned as above within one week before the Superintendent of Police, Sonipat alongwith the recorded conversations etc., needless to say, it is expected that Superintendent of Police, Sonipat shall look into the matter and take necessary action as may be/if any, required.

Petition is disposed of, accordingly.
