The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.282 dated 21.08.2019, under Sections 316, 326, 326-A and 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Murthal, District Sonapat.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegations are that the petitioner is stated to have poured acid on the complainant, who is his wife. He, however, contends that the complainant has fully recovery from the injuries. The petitioner is a labourer and is in custody for over 09 months. They have two minor children, who are being brought up by the paternal uncle of the petitioner.

Learned State counsel states that although the challan has been filed but no prosecution witnesses has been examined.

Heard through video conferencing.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, especially when the petitioner is in custody for over 09 months, the complainant has fully recovery from the injuries, Covid 19 pandemic and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.

The petitioner shall maintain good behaviour and will report to the Police Station, Murthal on every alternate Sunday till the conclusion of the trial.
