SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are the accused persons in FIR No. 66 dated 12.04.2008 registered under Sections 324, 323, 34 IPC at Police Station Sadar Faridkot (Annexure P-1) and rapat No.28 dated 19.04.2008, (which Section 326 IPC was later on added), have prayed for quashing of FIR along with all subsequent proceedings, on the basis of Compromise Deed dated 11.03.2019 (Annexure P-3) arrived at between the parties.

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the respondent No.2-complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused persons/petitioners, vide Compromise Deed dated 11.03.2019 (Annexure P-3), which is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

3. The Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Faridkot, vide report dated 15.06.2019, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is voluntarily.

4. Respondent No.2 is represented by his Counsel and does not oppose the compromise.

5. In view of the report of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Faridkot, and in view of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **“Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **“Narinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the accused persons/petitioners.

6. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No. 66 dated 12.04.2008 registered under Sections 324, 323, 34 IPC at Police Station Sadar Faridkot (Annexure P-1) and rapat No.28 dated 19.04.2008, (which Section 326 IPC was later on added), along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, is hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
