Application is allowed. Exemption granted as prayed for.

The petitioner is the accused in FIR No. 25 dated 23.02.2020 on the file of P.S. Fatehgarh Sahib, registered under Section 420 IPC and Section 4 of the Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, 1978. By way of this petition, he seeks grant of anticipatory bail.

Ms. Chhavi Sharma, learned counsel, entered appearance on behalf of the complainant, the second respondent herein. She confirmed that the dispute was duly settled by and between the parties and a compromise

was arrived at. Mr. Mehardeep Singh Dullat, learned Additional Advocate General, Punjab, appearing for the State, also affirms this fact.

In the light of the amicable settlement arrived at by and between the parties and as the case does not involve a heinous offence, this Court is of the opinion that the petitioner would be entitled to relief, subject to conditions.

The petition is accordingly allowed directing the release of the petitioner on bail in the event of his arrest in FIR No. 25 dated 23.02.2020 on the file of P.S. Fatehgarh Sahib, subject to the petitioner furnishing a personal bond for a sum of Rs. 10,000/- along with two sureties for a like sum each to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions stipulated in Section 438(2).
