1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to the outbreak of pandemic Covid-19.
2. Prayer in the Criminal Writ Petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus for directing respondent Nos.1 to 3 to provide protection of life and liberty to the petitioners as also for restraining respondent Nos.4 to 8 or any other person from interfering in the peaceful life of the petitioners. Prayer is also for directing respondent No.3 to consider and decide the representation, Annexure P/4 dated 17.06.2020 filed by the petitioners.
3. At the outset, learned counsel for the petitioners states that compromise talks are going on between the parties, therefore, the petitioners do not wish to press the writ petition at this stage and may be permitted to withdraw the same with liberty to file a fresh petition if cause survives.
4. Mr. Gagandeep Wasu, Addl. PP, UT, who is present in Court states that he has no objection to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioners.
5. In view of the statement of learned counsel for the petitioners, the present petition is dismissed as withdraw with the liberty as prayed for.
