The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in the event of his arrest in FIR No.75 dated 19.10.2017 under Sections 452, 354-B, 323 and 506 read with Section 34 IPC registered at Police Station Tibber, District Gurdaspur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that pursuant to the order dated January 02, 2018 as well as subsequent order dated 17.07.2019 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Rachpal Singh, does not dispute the aforesaid fact and states that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is no more required at this stage. She further states that the recovery of hard disc and mobile phone has already been effected from the petitioner.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is no more required, the present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated January 02, 2018 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
