The present writ petition has been filed by Smt. Ved Kumari claiming certain benefits in respect of the services rendered by her late husband, who retired in the year 1960 after attaining the age of superannuation.

From the order dated 03.03.2009 passed in CWP No.19882 of 2001, Smt. Ved Kumari has been shown as deceased and was being represented by legal representatives.

That being so, it is clear that Smt. Ved Kumari is no more in this world and no one has been impleaded as legal heirs on her behalf so as to continue with the present proceedings.

In view of the above, the present writ petition is dismissed for non-prosecution with liberty to the legal heirs of the petitioner, if any, that in case any grievance of the petitioner still survives, the present writ petition can be revived by filing an appropriate application.

Dismissed for non-prosecution with above observations.
