Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.30 dated 08.02.2017, under Section 420 IPC and Section 24 Immigration Act, registered at Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana on the basis of compromise (Anneuxre P-2) and consequential proceedings arising therefrom.

On 28.09.2017, notice of motion in the petition was issued for 30.10.2017 and in the meanwhile, the parties were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements. The said order was not complied with and again a similar direction was issued on 11.09.2018. The order dated 11.09.2018 reads as under:

“Mr. Varun Garg, Advocate, puts in appearance on behalf of respondent No.2 and seeks one more opportunity for getting the statements of the parties recorded as regards the compromise.

Pursuant to order dated 28.09.2017, parties are again directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq

*Magistrate on 11.10.2018 for getting their statements recorded. After recording the statements of the parties as regards genuineness of compromise, the learned trial Court/Illaqa Magistrate shall send a report to this Court before the next date of hearing.
Adjourned to 26.11.2018.”*

Pursuant to the above order, no report has been received, which makes it clear that the parties did not appear for recording their statements in respect of the compromise.

In view of the above, it is evident that the compromise is not supported by the parties, therefore, the petition fails and is dismissed.
