Matter has been taken up through Video Conferencing via Webex facility in the light of the Pandemic Covid-19 situation and as per instructions.

Instant petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking benefit of regular bail to the petitioner pending trial in a complaint case bearing Complaint No.NDPS 06 of 2015 titled as “Narcotic Control Bureau through Amit Kumar Sharma, Intelligence Officer, Delhi Zonal Unit, New Delhi Vs. Baz Mohamad & others” dated 10.03.2015, under Sections 8/21/23/29 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station City Sonipat, District Sonipat.

Counsel at the very outset makes a statement that he would not be pressing the instant petition on merits. He seeks indulgence of this Court for expeditious conclusion of the trial.

In support of such alternate prayer, counsel submits that the petitioner has already faced incarceration for a period of almost five years

and urges that speedy trial is a right vested with each and every accused.

Without making any observations on merit, instant petition is disposed of with direction to the trial Court to make an earnest endeavour to expedite the trial and to conclude the same.
