The petitioner prays for issuance of direction to respondent No.2 to protect life and property of the petitioner at the behest of respondents No.3 to 5 with a further direction to respondent No.2 to take action on DDR No.29 dated 09.04.2020 under Section 174 Cr.P.C registered at Police Station Sadar Khanna, District Ludhiana.

Perusal of allegations levelled in the DDR lodged at the behest of petitioner would reveal that petitioner has not levelled any allegation against any person with regard to unfortunate death of his son aged about 26 years. In the petition, he has sought to indict one Amritpal Singh – respondent No.4. There is no allegation in the petition attributing any motive to said Amritpal Singh. The allegations that deceased was last seen together with Amritpal Singh are vague because he has not mentioned the name of any person who is a witness of the last seen. Though, it is unfortunate that son of the petitioner has died at a very young age but it is

not a fit case for interference in exercise of jurisdiction under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

Consequently, the petition stands disposed of but without prejudice to right of the petitioner to take recourse to alternate remedy, in accordance with law.
