By this order, two criminal petitions i.e CRM-M-19270-2020 and CRM-M-19678-2020 shall stand disposed of.

Kunal and Arun (petitioner in both the petitions) pray for bail pending trial in a criminal case arising from FIR No.13 dated 6.2.2020 registered under Section 323, 324, 427, 451, 148, 149 IPC and Section 307 IPC added later on, at Police Station Cantt, District Jalandhar.

In brief, the case of the prosecution has been noticed by the

learned Additional Sessions Judge, Jalandhar in para 6 of the order, which is extracted as under:-

“6. The record has been received. Perusal of the record shows that present FIR has been registered on the statement of Sandeep Kumar S/o Late Sh. Brij Lal, R/o H.No. 86, Street No.5, Master Mahinga Singh Colony, PS Jalandhar Cantt. As per his statement that on 06.02.2020 at about 12:05 PM, he was present at his shop along-with Vishal, Vicky and Rohit, when Vishal came out from the shop and saw that 4-5 persons were abusing with Vishal and on raula, he also came out from the shop to sort out the dispute and on his intervention, they all left the spot and went towards Deep Nagar. After 5-7 minutes, they along-with other unknown persons came in car and motorcycle in front of his shop, when the complainant collecting the money which was about Rs.48,000/-, snatched the said amount and also damaged his shop. When the complainant and Vishal came out from the shop and objected the same, then they caused injuries to them and ran away from the spot.”

The petitioners are in custody for a period of 47 days. On conclusion of the investigation, the challan against the petitioners has already been presented in the Court. The petitioners are not stated to be

involved in any other criminal case.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that both the petitioners are not attributed to have played any active role, apart from being present at the time of occurrence.

Without commenting on the merits of the case and keeping in view the aforesaid facts, it is considered appropriate to release the petitioners on regular bail on their furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Petitions stand allowed.
