The petitioner-M/s Indoco Remedies Ltd. has invoked the jurisdiction of this Court by way of present civil writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents No.2 to 4 to take immediate legal action against respondents No.5 and 6 for carrying on nefarious illegal trade union activities and restraining them from

preventing the staff of the petitioner from carrying on their business activities.

Upon hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and on perusal of the records, the present petition stands disposed off with a direction to the respondents No.2 to 4 to look into the complaints/representations earlier moved by the petitioner dated 28.01.2020, 13.02.2020 and 11.07.2020 (Annexures P-20, 21 and 22, respectively) fully in accordance with law preferably within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the copy of this order.

In the meanwhile, to ensure that none of the respondents No.5 and 6 or their cohorts cause or carry on any act/activity which is detrimental in the day to day business activities of the petitioner and to ensure due and prompt action, if any instance is brought to the notice, in accordance with law.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
