This order will dispose of CRM-M No.19855 of 2020 titled Raj Kumar @ Santu @ Billa Vs. State of Punjab and CRM-M No.19928 of 2020 titled Narinder Singh @ Ninder Vs. State of Punjab as these have emanated from FIR No.154 dated 01.05.2020 registered at Police Station City Kapurthala, District Kapurthala for offence punishable under Sections 307, 323, 324, 506, 188, 148 and 149 of Indian Penal Code (in short 'IPC').

Counsel for the petitioners would argue that injuries sustained by complainant namely Parminder Singh are simple in nature constituting

offence under Section 323 IPC. It is further argued that petitioners are ready to join investigation and cooperate throughout.

Counsel representing State of Punjab, on the contrary, would argue that both the petitioners caused injuries on head of Parminder Singh and injury No.1 is an incised wound present on left side of forehead and injury No.2 is a lacerated wound on left temporal region. It is further argued that since the petitioners caused injuries on vital part of complainant with an intention to kill him, they do not deserve to be extended benefit of bail in anticipation of arrest. He would further inform that against petitioner – Raj Kumar another FIR bearing No.121 dated 31.05.2019 for offence under Sections 452, 353, 323, 506 IPC has been registered in Police Station City Kapurthala, District Kapurthala and against petitioner – Narinder @ Ninder, FIR No.40 dated 07.04.2018 under Section 15 of the Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 has been registered in Police Station Sadar, Kapurthala..

Taking into consideration the manner in which the petitioners assaulted the complainant and caused injuries on his head, they do not deserve to be extended benefit of bail in anticipation of arrest. Accordingly, the petitions are dismissed.
