By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'regular bail, upon FIR no.39, dated 28.02.2020, having been registered at Police Station Sadar Narwana, District Jind, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under Sections 15/18 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the quantity of contraband stated to have been recovered from the co-accused of the petitioner was well below commercial quantity and even a co-accused, i.e. Virender @ Sonu, has been admitted to bail by this court on June 11, 2020, vide an order passed in CRM-M-13463 of 2020.

He submits that the petitioner has been only named by the co-accused upon a disclosure statement allegedly made before the police by the

aforesaid Virender @ Sonu.

Learned State counsel, on the other hand, though has not denied the factual position as narrated hereinabove, however, submits that there being another case registered against the petitioner, he does not deserve the concession of bail.

Having considered the matter, it seems that the trial is not likely to progress in the current situation, and with the accused from whom the contraband was recovered, having already been admitted to bail, without making any further comment on the actual merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned.
