Present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C is for grant of regular bail to petitioner-**Sahil** in case FIR No.256 dated 08.11.2018 under Sections 186, 307, 353 and 420 IPC read with Section 34 IPC and Section 25 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Sadar Panipat, District Panipat.

Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that petitioner is in custody since 08.11.2018 and he is no more required by the Police for any investigation purpose. He further submits that after completion of investigation, challan has been presented in the Court. He further urges that petitioner has no nexus whatsoever with the alleged offence. He further submits that no bodily injury was ever caused to any person of the complainant party. He further urges that since trial of the case would take sufficient time to conclude, no useful purpose would be served

by keeping the petitioner in custody further and he may be released on bail.

On the other hand, learned State counsel while opposing instant petition has vehemently argued that keeping in view seriousness of offence, petitioner does not deserve the concession of bail.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

At this stage, without commenting anything on the merits of the case lest it may prejudice the outcome of the trial but taking into consideration the fact that petitioner is in custody since 08.11.2018; that challan has been presented against the petitioner in the Court and that since trial of the case would take sufficient time to conclude, no useful purpose would be served by detaining the petitioner in custody further, thus, he deserves the concession of bail.

In view of above, instant petition for grant of regular bail moved by petitioner-**Sahil** is allowed and he is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Panipat, as the case may be.
