GIRISH AGNIHOTRI, J. (Oral)

The matter has been taken up through video-conferencing on account of restrictions due to outbreak of pandemic COVID-19.

Petitioner-Yogesh, stated to be aged 37 years, has filed the present petition *inter alia* with a prayer for issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari for setting aside the impugned orders dated 24.07.2020 and 30.07.2020 (Annexure P-5 & P-6 respectively), whereby, the Joint Departmental Inquiry has been initiated against the petitioner without assigning any proper reason.

Records of the case show that when the case came up for hearing on 17.08.2020, Assistant Advocate General, Haryana, had appeared for the State and counsel for the petitioner was also permitted time to place certain documents on record.

Since, no formal notice was issued, let notice of motion be issued.

Ms. Palika Monga, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of the State. She submits that reply on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4 had already been filed.

Today, on the resumed hearing of the case, learned counsel for the petitioner informs the Court that substantive relief has already been granted to the petitioner as the enquiry so initiated has been decided in his favour. In this view of the matter, he submits that no further orders are called for in the present writ petition as the same has become infructuous.

Accordingly, the present writ petition is disposed of as having become infructuous.
