The petitioner has filed the present civil writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of Certiorari for quashing the order dated 10.2.2020.

The petitioner is employed as a Head Constable with the Punjab Police. He was working as a Head Constable in RW Branch of Commissionerate, Ludhiana. On his request, he was transferred to District Hoshiarpur vide order dated 1.11.2019. The petitioner claims that he was relieved from Commissionerate, Ludhiana on 11.2.2020 and he joined at Hoshiarpur on 12.2.2020.

The Director General of Police, Punjab has passed a general order cancelling the transfer orders of 90 police officials on administrative grounds vide communication dated 20.2.2020.

The petitioner has challenged the aforesaid order by filing

the present writ petition. The petitioner also relies upon the recommendations made by Senior Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur dated 9.7.2020 to the effect that grandfather of the petitioner is 95 years of age, whereas his father had met with an accident and received injuries in his head. It has further been mentioned that wife of the petitioner is on the family way.

Transfer from one station to another is necessary incidence of the service. Annexure P-2 is a general order cancelling the transfer of 90 police officials.

Keeping in view the aforesaid facts, this Court does not find any ground to interfere in exercise of its power of judicial review.

Hence, dismissed.
