ARVIND SINGH SANGWAN, J. (ORAL)

Prayer in this petition is for grant of regular bail in FIR No.52 dated 04.03.2019 under Sections 302, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per allegations in the FIR, registered at the instance of Swaran Singh, father-in-law of the petitioner and father of deceased Rajvir Kaur, wife of the petitioner, marriage

between the petitioner and deceased was performed 07 and half years ago and two children are born out of this wedlock. On the eve of marriage of his younger daughter Manpreet Kaur, Paramjit Singh sent Rajvir Kaur to attend the marriage and the petitioner and his brother Buta Singh did not come. At about 4.00 pm, the petitioner and his brother Buta Singh came. Later on, on 04.03.2019, he received a call that his daughter Rajvir Kaur is killed. During the investigation, the police recorded statement of Satnam Singh and Chinda Singh under Section 161 Cr.P.C., before whom the petitioner and his brother Buta Singh made extra-judicial confession that the petitioner has killed his wife Rajvir Kaur along with his brother by strangulating.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has relied upon certain affidavits of the people to submit that the petitioner was present in the marriage, however, the same is matter of evidence and cannot be taken at this stage.

Learned State counsel has filed affidavit of DSP, Sub Division Ajnala, District Amritsar Rural, in which all the details about the investigation carried out by the police and submission of challan under Section 173 Cr.P.C. are given. It is further stated that the case is now fixed for prosecution evidence and co-accused Buta Singh is absconding and evading his arrest, therefore, proceedings declaring proclaimed offender are initiated against him.

In reply, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that opinion of Board of Doctors whether the death is suicidal or homicidal, is awaited and thereafter, supplementary challan under Section 173 (8) Cr.P.C. can be filed before the trial Court.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.

However, it will be open for the petitioner to file fresh bail application if some opinion of Board of Doctors comes in his favour.
