The case has been taken up for hearing through video-conferencing.

By way of filing the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have prayed for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents to protect their lives and liberties and also of a minor daughter of petitioner No.1 from being invaded by the private respondents.

Petitioners have pleaded that petitioner No.1 was married to one Hardev Singh of village Panjgrain, near Machiwara in the year 2010. Out of the wedlock, one girl, namely, Harpreet Kaur was born in the year 2015, who is with the petitioners. Hardev Singh was addicted to drugs and he went missing in the year 2015 itself and could not be traced

despite best efforts of petitioner No.1, her parents and in-laws. Parents-in-law of petitioner No.1 are no more in this world. Husband of petitioner No.1 was the only bread winner. Sister-in-law of petitioner No.1 is leading her happy married life. There was no family member in the house to look after petitioner No.1 and her minor daughter. Petitioner No.2 is resident of village Kalheri, Teshil and District Ropar. He has relations with the parental village of petitioner No.1. Petitioner No.2 came in contact with petitioner No.1 and agreed to help her and her minor child. Now they are living together at a secluded place, though having permanent resident of village Kalheri, they feel reasonable apprehension from private respondents, who are family members and relatives of petitioner No.1. Petitioners have also filed a complaint before respondent No.3 on 4.8.2020 against respondents No.4, 7, 9 and 11.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr.Ramandeep Sandhu, Sr.DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf respondents No.1 to 3.

In view of nature of order which this Court proposes to pass, there is no necessity of calling upon any response from the respondents.

In view of above, without meaning anything on the merits of the case, this petition is disposed of by directing

respondent No.3 to take notice of the complaint dated 4.8.2020 filed by the petitioners in accordance with law. If the petitioners are found in need of any police help, then the same be provided in accordance with law and to proceed with the complaint filed by them and decide the same in accordance with law preferably within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
