Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of direction to respondents No.2 and 3 to take appropriate legal action against the accused persons mentioned in the complaint dated 25.07.2017 (Annexure P-1) on the basis of which cognizance offence under Sections 406/498-A and 506 IPC is made out, but still no action has been taken by the police against the accused.

Reply by way of affidavit of Hardial Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, NRI, Jalandhar on behalf of respondents No.1 and 3, has been filed in Court, which is taken on record. As per the reply, enquiry to the complaint submitted by the petitioner was conducted by respondent No.3, who after collecting the required evidence, opined to consign the complaint to record room on 04.06.2018, as the complainant/ petitioner or her witnesses could not produce the trustworthy evidence

regarding miscarriage, extra marital affairs of her husband and demand of dowry. The report dated 04.06.2018 was forwarded to the office of DSP, NRI, Sub-Division, Jalandhar for their perusal, who after agreeing with earlier report, has opined to consign the complaint of the petitioner vide report dated 11.06.2018.

Since the allegations were not found trustworthy, the FIR was not registered.

In view of the reply, the present petition is dismissed as infructuous.
