This common order shall dispose of 10 writ petitions bearing CWP Nos.12739, 12742, 12744, 12746, 12747, 12749, 12750, 12753, 12754 and 12755 of 2020 involving similar facts and issues claiming identical reliefs.

Petitioner, a partnership firm, is a contractor engaged in the business of carrying out transport and handling services. The firm furnished its e-bids for 10 different routes for providing Adhoc Road Transport Services pursuant to the tender notices dated 28.07.2020 / 3.08.2020 floated by the respondent-Food Corporation of India. The technical bids were opened on 21.08.2020. The technical bids of the petitioner for the said 10 routes were rejected on the common ground that “the financial statements of

Assessment Years 2017-18 and 2018-19 are not legible”.

The submission of the petitioner is two fold:-(i) the financial statements of Assessment Years 2017-18 and 2018-19 are clearly legible; (ii) these very documents were earlier accepted as valid at the time of allotment of work in terms of the tender floated by the Food Corporation of India in December 2019 and June 2020 for different routes. Thus the rejection of technical bids is bad in law.

Learned counsel for the respondents-Food Corporation of India has relied upon sub-clause (c) of Clause XX of Model Tender Form (MTF) (at page 50), to submit that the petitioner had an effective alternative remedy to approach the Grievance Committee within 3 working days of their rejection of their technical bids and thus, these writ petitions are not maintainable. He, however, concedes that even these writ petitions being within time, can be considered as a representation in view of the aforesaid clause.

For ready reference, aforesaid clause (c) of Clause XX of MTF reads as under:-

*“The result of technical evaluation will be uploaded on the CPP portal. In case there are technically disqualified bidders, the reasons for disqualification will be uploaded and price bid shall be opened only after three working days. If any or the bidders is disqualified, **he may submit grievance (if any) to General Manager/Divisional Manager (Region) within three working days from the date of disqualification.** However, no new documents will be accepted. In case of receipt of grievance, General Manager/Divisional Manager will redress the grievance by passing Speaking Order within (7) working days. In case of receipt of grievance from any disqualified bidder, the validity period of the tender shall get*

automatically extended by 15 working days, which shall be binding on all the bidders.

Emphasis supplied”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that his clients have already filed their objections against the rejection of the technical bids for the said 10 routes, in terms of the aforesaid sub-clause (c), which, however, would not be an effective remedy, in the light of the financial bids to be opened today itself on 2.00 PM, thereby creating third party rights.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, we deem it appropriate to dispose of all these 10 writ petitions with a direction to the competent authority vested with the jurisdiction to decide the objections (if necessary including the contentions raised in the present writ petitions), filed by the petitioner, in terms of the aforesaid clause (c), in accordance with law.
