By this petition, the petitioner seeks quashing of FIR No.0066, dated 30.01.2019, registered at Police Station Sector 7, District Faridabad, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under Sections 323, 325, 427, 506, 509 and 34 of the IPC, as also all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of a compromise Annexure P-2, arrived at between the petitioner and respondent no.2

Pursuant to the order of this Court dated 05.10.2020, the report of the learned JMIC, Faridabad, dated 11.11.2020, is on record, stating to the effect that the statements of the petitioner, Narender Saini, as also the complainant in the FIR, i.e Bhawna Saini, and one Head Constable Sumit Kumar, were recorded before that court on 06.11.2020, to the effect that they have compromised the matter with each other and as per the assessment of the learned Magistrate, the compromise is seen to have been arrived at between the parties, without any undue influence, pressure or coercion.

That being so and with the learned State counsel submitting that as per his instructions there is no other criminal case registered against the petitioner, further looking at the nature of the offence alleged to have been committed by the petitioner, the present petition is allowed and FIR No.0066, dated 30.01.2019, registered at Police Station Sector 7, District Faridabad, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 323, 325, 427, 506, 509 and 34 of the IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
