JAISHREE THAKUR, J.(Oral)

1. This is a petition that has been filed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No. 186 dated 25.04.2020 under Sections 323, 324, 452, 148, 149, 506 IPC (Sections 326, 188, 269, 270 IPC and Section 51-B of Disaster Management Act added later on) registered at Police Station Jhabal, District Tarn Taran.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner inter-alia would contend that the injuries have been inflicted upon the non-vital part of the body of complainant and there is a delay of 05 days in filing of the FIR.

3. Notice of motion was issued in the matter, pursuant to which appearance has caused on behalf of the respondent-State as well as complainant.

4. Learned counsel for the complainant submits that even though the injury has been inflicted on a non-vital part of the body of complainant, however, as per MLR available with him, the bone is dislocated due to the said injury. It is further submitted that the injured is a 65 year old person.

5. I have heard counsel for the parties and have gone through the pleadings of the case as well as medical report of the complainant.

6. Admittedly, the petitioner attacked the complainant and his family members and caused serious injuries to them. Under these circumstances, once custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required for a result oriented investigation, this court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

7. In view of the above, the instant petition is hereby dismissed.
